RISK ASSESSMENT: Events with The M-Stage

Business Risks Before Event Arrival

(and after leaving the site following an event)
For transportation, the MStage packs up and travels as a normal vehicle, towing the operating trailer if this is required. The M-Stage is maintained to all legal requirements and checks on vehicle condition are undertaken before leaving the storage site. The MStage is licensed to carry 3 passengers including driver.

On arrival at site the crew will make contact with the Customer or other designated person to site the M-Stage. Prior to arrival, the Customer will have agreed that there is suitable access for the M-Stage

vehicle, and arranged for separate movement of the operating trailer where this is necessary. The driver will comply with all on site driving requirements such as speed limits and use of warning lights.

Equipment setup and takedown will be undertaken by at least two competent and trained members of crew. The working area will be clearly marked and no public access allowed until the Project Manager has declared it safe.

Equipment will be operated at all times within StageBus policies.
