## THE STAGE TRUCK

RISK ASSESSMENT: Events with The Truck Stage

### Risks Before Event Arrival

(and after leaving the site following an event)

For transportation, the Truck will pack up and travel as a normal vehicle, towing the operating trailer as required. The Truck is maintained to all legal requirements and checks on the vehicle's condition are undertaken before leaving the storage site.

The Truck is licensed to carry 7 passengers including driver.

#### **Risks on Arrival At Site**

On arrival at site the crew will make contact with the Customer or other designated person to site the Truck. Prior to arrival, the Customer will have agreed that there is suitable access for a HGV/the Truck, and arranged for separate movement of the operating trailer where this is necessary. The driver will comply with all on-site driving requirements, such as speed limits, designated road/track ways and the use of warning lights.

The working area will be clearly marked and no public access allowed until the Project Manager has declared it safe.

## Risks Whilst operating the Equipment

Stage Truck crew will operate the Equipment at all times during the performance except by prior arrangement. Should any other crew be used, such as touring sound engineers, the event Project Manager will remain in overall control and have the authority to overrule any decisions made by the crew member if it is deemed to pose risk to any person or piece of equipment. Equipment will be operated at all times within Stage Bus Ltd's policies.

# General Risks, relating to Crew

All crew members on site will be trained in the operation of Stage Truck equipment, and will have agreed to all working procedures etc. There will be at least one senior member of crew present ("the Project Manager"), who will liaise with all other crew members.

			require and that they are competent in the use of such equipment, e.g. inhalers. Crew members should assess all tasks on an individual basis before undertaking them and should inform the Manager if there is a problem.
	Aggravation of existing physical injury	Low - Medium	Crew must follow Stage Truck policy. Crew members should assess all actions on an individual task basis.
Medical Emergency	Injury / sickness	Low- High	Provide first aid treatment as soon as possible. Follow event procedures for escalating where appropriate.
Exposure to loud music	Hearing Damage	Medium	Crew to be provided with ear plugs and given opportunities to work in quieter areas.  Music volume should not exceed any level set by the customer or regulatory authorities, and Stage Bus Ltd. policy should be maintained at all times.
Lack of PPE / warm clothing	Injury / exposure to extreme temperatures / UV rays	Low - High	As workers are freelance, workers bring their own

			appropriate clothing. Clothing guidelines are issued to the crew. High visibility clothing and some spare warm clothing is kept on board the Truck and is provided where necessary.
Refreshments	Fatigue due to hunger	Medium	Basic non-perishable food supplies kept on the Truck. Opportunity to have at least one full meal during events lasting over 4 hours will be provided. Crew members advised that they may wish to bring their own food
	Dehydration	Medium	The Customer should provide "drinking water", that being water which meets the standards set out in the Drinking Water Directive (1998).
Toilets	Illness due to lack of access	Low	Customer will provide crew with access to toilets for the duration of the event.
	Illness due to contamination	Medium	Customer responsible for maintaining toilet facilities. Hand wipes and similar available on the Truck if required.
